- There is a clear system of rewards and sanctions
- Pupils who regularly follow the rules are noticed and rewarded
- Teachers and parents model positive behaviour

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# Stay On Green

A whole school behaviour policy



At Morningside Primary School we believe that every member of our school community has a responsibility to teach children socially acceptable behaviour.

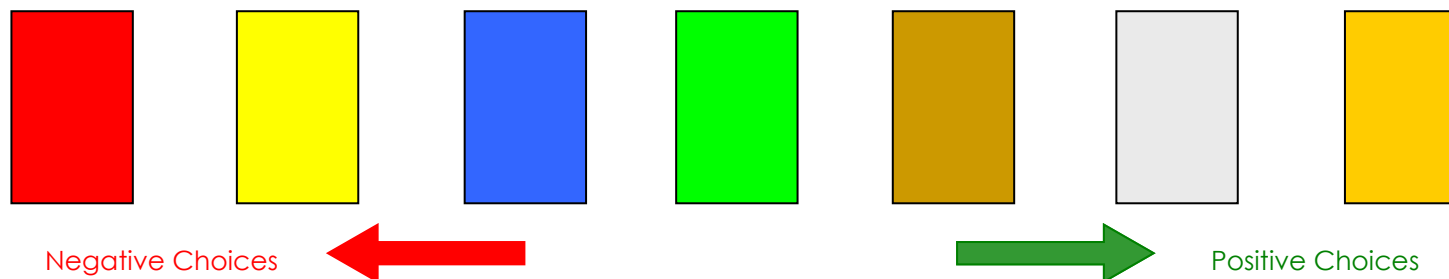


# All pupils start on green every day

Green means children are following the Morningside Messages, listening, following instructions and making good choices

In class we use colours to help children understand how well they are behaving. All pupils have their name on the behaviour chart. All pupils start every new day on green.

- If pupils make good choices about their behaviour they stay on green or move up on the chart (bronze, silver, gold)
- If pupils make unsuitable choices they move down the chart (blue, yellow, red)



## Consequences

At least one warning is **always** provided for pupils in between each stage. Teachers constantly help pupils make the right choices to move their colour back to green and beyond.

The following colours are consequences:

- Blue** Warning
- Yellow** Reflection Time in the classroom away from the group, on the reflection table
- Red** Reflection Time in partner class with reflection sheet. Once pupil has returned to class they will move back to yellow and are encouraged to make the right choices to return to green as quickly as possible.

### Further consequences

#### Senior Management Team involvement

Pupil name is recorded. The Senior Management Team will assess the incident and decide on an appropriate consequence. This may include contacting parents /carers.

## Rewards

### Individual

The following colours let children know that they are making the right choices.

- Green** Green points to go to whole class total towards green time on Friday
- Bronze** Sticker
- Silver** Sticker
- Gold** Gold award

### Whole Class

Teachers award green time on Friday to their class. The amount of time depends on how many pupils have stayed on green.
